1. <b>labrys</b>	a double-headed axe
2. <b>larnax</b>	a container for human bones
3. <b>libation</b>	the pouring of wine or oil onto the ground as an offering to a god or hero
4. <b>lustration</b>	a ritual washing or purification rite
5. <b>magazine</b>	a storehouse or warehouse for goods
6. <b>Minotaur</b>	a monster being half man and half bull
7. <b>mural</b>	relating to a wall
8. <b>obsidian</b>	a glass-like volcanic rock
9. <b>ossuary</b>	a bone storage area
10. <b>pantheon</b>	the collective group of all the gods
11. <b>papyrus</b>	material made from plant fibre, resembles paper
12. <b>pithos</b>	a large clay storage jar
13. <b>polythrya</b>	many doors set between piers
14. <b>rhyton</b>	drinking horn vessel
15. <b>sacrophagus</b>	a stone or wood box for a dead body
16. <b>sistrum</b>	a rattle used to accompany singing
17. <b>stele</b>	upright slab or pillar of stone bearing an inscription or carving
18. <b>stratigraphy</b>	the recording of the different levels of strata of ground as it is dug down into
19. <b>tablet</b>	a flat and smooth piece of compressed damp clay for writing on with a sharp implement
20. <b>thalassocracy</b>	rule of the sea; sea-based empire
21. <b>tholos</b>	a round, sometimes domed structure
22. <b>tumulus</b>	a man-made mound of earth
23. <b>villa</b>	a substantial, self-sufficient country house
24. <b>wanax</b>	a king or chief in Mycenaean times
25. <b>xoanon</b>	a crudely made effigy of a god
